

Candace Williams is an Immigration Services Officer II (ISO II) for the Employment Division at the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) Texas Service Center in Irving, Texas. She is responsible for the adjudication of Form I-140, Immigrant Petition for Alien Workers. She is also a member of the Awards and Recognition Working Group at the Texas Service Center.
